



“ON THE ROAD TO EMMAUS” ROTATION

WORKSHOP 4 – May 17, 2020 – 10am

Story: Luke 24: 13-35

Key Memory Verse:

Matthew 18:20 – *“Where two or three come together in My name, there am I with them.” (NIV)*

QUEST Verse:

Luke 24: 30b-31a – *“...He took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were open, and they recognized Him”. (NIV)*

Rotation Objectives – Students will:

- locate the book of Luke in the New Testament and be able to retell the events that took place along a road leading to the town of Emmaus.
- know that Jesus appeared to many of His followers after His crucifixion. They didn’t always recognize Him immediately but once they did, this helped them believe the resurrection.
- understand that Jesus revealed himself in the story by the breaking of bread and He continues to be revealed when we celebrate communion.
- examine ways we can open our eyes and recognize God’s presence and activity in our own lives.
- explore what it means to “walk” with Jesus in our continuing faith journey.
- recite Matthew 18:20 (NIV) and Luke 24: 30b-31a (NIV)
- enjoy their study; be blessed by the study; have fun!

Workshop 4 Overview:

Children will review the story of Emmaus by retelling the main events using their own words. They will then look at different artists’ depictions of the Road to Emmaus, noting similarities and differences in each piece. Finally, there will be time for each child to create their own unique interpretations of the story and share their masterpieces with each other.

- White paper – drawing, construction or copy paper will do
- Markers, colored pencils or watercolors
- For Younger Children: You can print out one of the coloring sheets at the end of this document.




