WORKSHOP 1 - A Reputation of Strength

June 7, 2020 – 10am

Story: Daniel 1: 1-20

Workshop Overview:

In this workshop, the lesson will focus on how Daniel and his three friends had **strength** to stand firm in their convictions not to eat the king's food or drink his wine – no matter how tempting that may have been. They will see through Daniel's example that consistently living a pure and holy life builds a strong, Godly reputation.

Key Memory Verse:

1 Corinthians 16:13 – *"Watch; stand fast in the faith; be brave; be strong."* (NKJV)

QUEST Verse:

James 1: 2-3 – *"... You will face all kinds of trouble. When you do, think of it as pure joy. Your faith will be tested. You know that when this happens it will produce in you the strength to continue."* (NirV)

Rotation Objectives – Children will be able to:

- locate the book of Daniel in the Old Testament and retell the key events of Daniel's life in their own words.
- understand that Daniel was a prophet. God had given him a great gift to let others know what God was telling them through their dreams.
- see that through his entire life, Daniel's actions built a reputation of integrity, strength, courage, humility and faith.
- realize that throughout Daniel's entire life, he never wavered in his faith in God. He was just a young teen, not much older than our GODQUEST kids, when the book begins and it ends with Daniel as a very old man, well into his 80's.
- know that Daniel maintained a vibrant faith in God despite living and working in an ungodly culture surrounded by unbelievers and experiencing a lot of trials and trouble in his life.
- explore what it means for us to live a life that is pleasing to God even when others around us aren't.
- recite 1 Corinthians 16:13 (NIV) and James 1: 2-3 (NirV)
- enjoy their study; be blessed by the study; have fun!
